Responsibilities:

The successful candidate will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate piano students, concomitant masterclass and chamber music coaching, to coordinate and teach the full range of undergraduate musicianship skills courses, and to engage in a broad range of institutional and professional service. Other courses may be assigned depending upon the successful candidate's secondary expertise.

Qualifications:

The ideal candidate will hold a Doctorate in piano performance (ABD may be considered) with a successful performance record. They will have demonstrated success in teaching piano, piano pedagogy, piano repertoire, musicianship skills, and music theory at the postsecondary level.
